Focus:

The purpose of this lesson is to educate students on how traffickers can use power and control to pressure victims into Human Trafficking.

Statement of Objective

By the end of this lesson, students will be able to describe signs of unhealthy relationships and how traffickers exploit victims who are susceptible to unhealthy relationships. They will have the opportunity to discuss what to do if they feel that they/someone they know is involved in an unhealthy relationship.

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Teacher Input

Your purpose in this lesson is to facilitate student discussion in a safe environment. Maintaining a respectful dialogue is paramount. Before watching the video or completing the guided discussion, make sure to set clear ground rules using cues on slide 2 of the Powerpoint.

Guided Practice & Discussion

For the sake of review, you will present the definition of sex trafficking. Instructors will need to take additional time to discuss this definition than in ensuing years.

Assessment
